Welcome to Stenton Park



We consider Stenton Park to be an extension of Front Step's ministry at 16th and Courtland Streets. Stenton Park is situated directly across from the urban ministry center. On a hot summer day you will find plenty of kids playing. It does not have much to offer but it's the best they have.

Because the grass only gets mowed once every few weeks it is normally too tall to play any kind of sport. The grounds are littered with trash and empty dime bags left behind by drug users.

There is a playground, but it is usually littered with broken glass and is generally unsafe for smaller children to play. Horse shoe pits that are now covered with weeds serve as a reminder that this park was once full of life.

Our goal is to improve the quality of living in the community by partnering with local residents and officials. We want to clean up the park and assist in providing safe activities for the neighborhood children and youth.

Maybe some from your ministry team would like to plan a special activity or event in the park (Sports camp, picnic, arts and crafts, concerts, clean-up and repair).

What Can You Do Now?
